Predator control project (Issue 5 | September 2021)

Kia ora koutou, and welcome to our fifth quarterly newsletter - and boy do we have a lot to share!

This marks just over one year since our community predator control project kicked off in Black Swamp. A huge thank you to everyone who has become involved thus far, already we have removed a huge number of predators which can only be good news for our native wildlife! Welcome to our trappers in Tomarata - Te Ārai, it has been fantastic to see how many of you are already undertaking predator control in these communities.

With the expansion of efforts and the addition of new predator control zones, we are now going by the overarching name 'The Conservation Coast' to refer to our combined efforts.

This includes predator control being undertaken by the community at Black Swamp, Tomarata, - Te Ārai and Te Ārai Regional Park, and privately at Tara iti golf club, and the Te Ārai south precinct.

Combined, this effort now consists of over 900 traps, 600 bait stations, and has removed over three thousand one hundred predators!

This is a truly incredible result, and really shows the benefit of working together to protect our fantastic wild places.

Here you can find information on each of the predator control zones, the ecosystems and wildlife we are trying to conserve, how many predators have been removed, and links to Trap.NZ where you can record your catch data.
