Predator control project (Issue 8 | June 2022)

Kia ora koutou, and welcome to the eighth edition of our quarterly update. This must mean we're about two years in to our predator control journey.

The Tomarata-Te Ārai Zone is now set up, adding another 200 traps to our ever-growing network. It's lovely to see everyone in the community so keen to help out and be involved!

We've also set up a trap line with the kids at Mangawhai Beach School, with very enthusiastic students catching two rats on their first check.

Speaking of rats; it been a particularly 'ratty' few months. Since March, 214 rats have been caught within the Conservation Coast. Some people have even reported

catching rats within hours of setting their traps.

It's incredible to see what has been achieve by this collective effort, with over 1,000 traps set and over 4,500 predators removed to date! Over the coming months we plan to complete our final expansion south into Pākiri, the final step in making our coastline a safe haven for our native plants and wildlife!
