Predator control project (Issue 9 | September 2022)

Kia ora, and welcome to our ninth quarterly update.

As the Conservation Coast continues to expand, we are now linking up to other fantastic landscape scale conservation projects. To the North we join Piroa-Brynderwyns Landcare, and to the South, the Forest Bridge Trust.

Combined, these three projects equate to almost 90,000ha!

Predator control at this scale will be hugely beneficial for our native biodiversity, helping to protect and connect entire ecosystems and everything within – from Kiwi to Katipo.

It is exciting to see the pieces of the puzzle come together and what can be achieved when we all work together!



Continuing on the theme of collaboration, we are super excited to have kaitiaki from Te Uri O Hau coming onboard to help maintain the trap network.

Supported by the Shorebirds Trust, Te Uri O Hau have developed a strategic plan and are now tackling predator control throughout their rohe.

In the last quarter we have caught 464 predators; including 65 mustelids, 52 possum, 114 hedgehogs and 233 rats.

This brings the grand total to 4,987 pests removed within the Conservation Coast!



Combined, these three projects equate to almost 90,000 ha of predator control.

If you are struggling to maintain your traps, need a refresher on how to set traps, or use Trap.NZ to record your catches please do get in touch, we are more than happy to help.
